

Q & A

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

My forefathers migrated to India in 1947 from Sindh Pradesh of Pakistan and most of my family are in the fresh fruit business. However, my calling had limited interest in being involved in conventional business so, I carved my path out. Even though I am third generation entrepreneur in the food sector but, I diversified within the segment. I am Founder and Director of Max Inc., a leading importer and exporter of high value processed food items from India. I am also the founder and director for Forum of Indian Food Importers (FIFI), a not for profile apex chamber, which works towards establishing inroads for international food and beverage trade in India. Additionally, I am a member of the Government of India's Food Safety and Standard Authorities' committee member working on food regulatory ecosystem to facilitate investment and trade development in the country. Furthermore, I hold few more responsible positions representing international trade in India at numerous forums like a board member for Indo Italian Chamber of Commerce, member of FMCG committee at ASSOCHAM, jury member for annual Coca-Cola golden spoons awards, jury member of OSPITALITA ITALIANA RISTORANTI ITALIANI NEL MONDO, jury member for Annapurna world food India annual awards, and chairperson of India Food Delegation to name a few.

I am an alumnus of the U.S. Government's professional exchange program International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP) and a recipient of the fellowship from the Fresno State University, California. I have also studied international trade and business at the University of Queensland, Australia, and the Indian Institute of Foreign Trade, New Delhi, India.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

This may sound platitudinous but, I truly believe in the work I do and I do not find it banal. Working in the food and beverage sector has so many related aspects that its indeed a roller coaster ride – the sheer excitement to be on this journey with an effort to manoeuver oneself is quite enterprising. The F&B ecosystem is so interconnected and intermingled that the impact is far-reaching from the farmers to a procurement officer to a chef to a consumer to a retailer to a policymaker. With this sensitivity involved, I strive to stay ahead of the curve and not get disrupted by changes – as not only mine but, there are families that are directly or indirectly obstructed by any disruption if that happens in my organization. This entails upon a socio-economic responsibility, which keeps me happy and motivated.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

Food is the only essence of life, which transgresses boundaries and brings about a smile on everyone's face. My ardor for food has always kept me enriching my life and soul. It is an industry, which works with an added edge of passion binding people together. India's diverse palate has always played a crucial role to accept the global taste and remodelling it with our own Indian interpretation.

There is nothing to dislike in the industry nonetheless, this new influx of so-called "foodies" without an inherent understanding of ingredients or cuisines has made the industry susceptible giving negative connotation. Also, the consumer sensitivities are quite high as a result of which we see how some myths can have mammoth negative impact on those engaged in business. Recently attributing to fake reports in India that consuming poultry can cause Covid-19; the poultry sector has had to cull flocks, thereby reducing its demand for feed maize which, in turn, depressed the domestic maize price and had a continued ripple effect.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

On the face of it being an individual involved in the food and beverage business however, my profile only reflects a superficial facet of my work and personality without any comprehension of the multifaceted layers. I am an avid traveller who loves to explore local culture through food stories and a social animal looking forward for enriching my life. Every travel tale has something special and I feel blessed to have had an opportunity to augment my personality and knowledge about socio-economic situations, culture, and civilizations through my escapades to over 100 countries. I am not a backpack traveller but, I am certainly a person who can stop at even the tiniest food joint in the middle of nowhere and does not shy away from trying any local food. Additionally, whenever I am traveling, I always look upon myself as a brand ambassador of India and think this is a self-imposed responsibility, we all should put upon ourselves. Philanthropy should be as discrete as this statement and to your inner self.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

Definitely your timing or luck as many call it plays a crucial role coupled with passion and knowledge topped with a vision. Also, for any business person to be successful they need to be Indian street smart from where I see it's difficult to be an absolute socialist. Most of the life's lessons are not taught in any business school, one needs to have the ability to make mistakes, admit to the mistakes, be amendable with a continued strive to learn. Beneath the fancy dining images and travel postings, is a life that is assiduous requiring yourself to roll up your sleeves and be ready to get involved in every layer of the business to understand the intricacies. It is not entirely food or entrepreneurship but a perfect steadiness between the two. While these skills and relationships can be difficult to develop but, not impossible to achieve, we have seen numerous young entrepreneurs leaving a mark and building upon success stories for many to learn from.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

My irrational or rational passion outside of my work has been food and travel in that order. If I walk down the memory lane then I see my crazy love for food that led me into this line of work and it is invigorating to work into this segment every day. Having travelled 100's of kilometres to nosh on something I dreamt about or saw in a food blog has galvanized me. It is awesome, delicious, inventive, colorful, appealing, inspiring, educational, therapeutic, and so much more. Trust me it is not necessary that you find the crème da la crème only with a Michelin star chef but, many times they can be hiding somewhere in bylanes of any city or an ancient wall in a hole outlet. All I do is keep looking for these hidden gems across the globe and see the world through the lens of food that the locals eat. I have learned over a period of time that if you dream food then it can convert any unassuming gathering into a culinary delight and also feasting takes away the week-long stretch of business leaving you charged up for your next spree.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

This is a phase that had an impact on every walk of life no one can claim that they were immune to the global pandemic. COVID-19 has disrupted normal life and has enforced a substantial change in the policies, priorities, and activities of individuals, organizations, and governments all across the world and India is no exception to the same. These changes are proving to be a catalyst for changing consumer behavior, purchase decisions, hospitality and travel, adoption of new purchase routes, technology, innovation, and many more. Many sectors even within the food and beverage category, which was otherwise essential, have seen a catastrophic impact from a total collapse o sales to higher cess being imposed to many establishments shutting operations to job losses to massive growth in health categories to hyper localization. Disposable incomes and confidence are continuing to take a dramatic tumble and that we are seeing an impact of economic turmoil.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

Exposure is a big challenge, which fortunately is evolving with more technological advancements, however; the holistic sensory advancement is still deficient. Many restaurant operators and businesses end up taking a leap of faith based on their global exposure which numerous times is slightly ahead of the time and leads to limited or no acceptance from the consumers. It's a continuous effort to tweak the portfolios based on the evolving market dynamics and we get great pleasure in engaging with our end customers with an effort to grow with them, but everything comes at a cost and several times it's a heavy price we end up paying as businesses. This is not very encouraging for new entrepreneurs and often results in less inventive introductions with us continuing to remain a mass market.

Also, the agriculture, food, and beverage industry are recurrently perceived as an area that should stay away from capitalistic ideas. This reflection needs to advance and it is necessary to improvise the entire value chain to bring in a more all-inclusive approach. This is not a new narrative nonetheless, an extremely valuable one, which needs immediate intervention not only from the government but, from everyone involved in the value chain. When consumers are willing to pay the highest price for a hand-crafted piece of silk scarf then they should also appreciate the craftsmanship involved in this sector. Unfortunately, this is a huge drawback I see in my day to day interactions and I also fear with this many artisanal products might get lost in time.

Additionally, in a country like India we cannot afford food waste in any form. Consumer education is of utmost necessity in this aspect for example many times products are disposed off either by the sellers or the consumers with the translation of regulatory language like best before or use by. We are a country of 1.3 billion people with an extreme socio-economic divide with a staggering amount of balanced diet issues. It's heartbreaking to see that something which should be linked with food quality is mapped with the food safety and instead of reaching someone's plate lands up in a bin. Many advanced economies are running massive campaigns in this regard and I appeal to all stakeholders concerned to take serious steps in this regard to help prevent and reduce foodwastage.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

Global pandemic situation is a classic example which has displayed that when most of the external elements were on standstill, food was the binding factor. By basic nature we humans are social beings and we need connecting points - the detox therapy around cooking was the epicenter of family events and also help people connect through social media channels.

An age-old business, which is as old as human civilization stood the test of time and has grown exponentially. Today I take great pride in the fact that the world wants to come to India and we are showcasing our tenacious values of being a melting pot and opening up to the global market trends while continuing to stay connected with its traditions. What motivates me every day is the joy of being a believer of this universal religion we call food, work for it, and be involved in erudition discussions around the same.

Besides, I must mention the most fulfilling is to be able to rescue animals like birds, squirrels, cats and dogs. They shower you with so much gratitude its unbelievable. The pigeons and squirrels I've rescued come find me after getting released from foster veterinary care.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

Post pandemic, I can see clients with more focused approach to growing their business via diversifying to emerging lines of products and services. Technology as a tool for efficient operation isn't debatable anymore. Investors are more keen to look into Alternative Investment Funds, thats so important for a developing economy since the money is used to build other businesses rather than just sitting in the bank.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

What we are selling here cannot be seen or held in hands, that's the biggest challenge. How do you align with your clients' goals and create deliverables that helps him trust you to pay. I grew up in the United States and taught myself how to play dhol. My mother taught me some basic dholki rhythms and I fell in love with beats and bass at the age of four. I obsessively studied the drum patterns in songs of Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan, Anoop Jalota, Jagjit Singh, Sardool Sikandar, Malkit Singh, and Gurdas Mann (for example) and playing dhol became second nature and my true love. Since then, I have been fortunate to play dhol for Sukhshinder Shinda, Hrithik Roshan, and several other artists.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

I truly love to celebrate life and find reasons to find enjoyment the small things that we all take for granted. Playing dhol let's me connect with others during their significant moments and I'll always know that I was a part of how they felt in those memories of happiness and excitement.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

One of the initial challenges I have disliked in the past occurred when navigating conversations with men who attempt to strong-arm performance rates, or terms of my event contracts.

Because I truly play dhol from my heart, I can genuinely and sincerely decline opportunities that don't support me as a musician.

I had to first decide what I prioritized, then how I would exchange my time as a dhol player for a justified rate, and then adhere to it without negation. Every Desi loves to bargain, but when you negotiate with someone who has put in hundreds — maybe thousands of hours to their craft, then asking for discounts or to play "for exposure" is disrespectful.

Eventually, I learned how to set expectations and create solutions for myself and others. When I couldn't, I just learned to say no. It's difficult to decline events because I would love to play dhol everywhere but sometimes, a girl has to say no.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I am an artist in every sense of the word so in addition to being an instrumentalist, I enjoy singing, writing, drawing, building, landscaping, etc. I am currently planning a geodesic dome greenhouse which I'd like to build in my backyard, but I have to teach myself everything as usual. Ask me about those details another day.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

I consider myself a Type A personality and do not mince words. To be successful in anything, you need to understand how and when to speak directly, and for me I find it very simple because I speak from my heart. I rest my head every night peacefully without having to keep up with lies, or wonder if I should've done something differently. Additionally, I don't regret my decisions because I don't operate out of obligation. As the saying goes: when you love what you do, it doesn't feel like work.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

I have a psychology background and enjoy studying personalities, behaviors, and micro-expressions. Understanding the mind and how our brains correlate to our behaviors throughout every stage of life will forever intrigue me. Chess is an interesting way to read people.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

The pandemic pretty much cancelled my club events, concerts shows, and reduced the number of shaadi events throughout 2020 but 2021 is rising beautifully. Before the pandemic, I never thought about if playing dhol in public spaces meant potentially getting and now I have to consider these things because no one wants to cause problems for their families, or anyone for that matter.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

When you find something in life that allows you to achieve your flow state, don't let it go. Live in your element, learn everything about it, keep falling in love with it, and allow yourself to become stronger. Seek out a balance that does not guilt you for your passions, and does not sacrifice those needs unless it is on your terms. Teach others, and continue to remain a lifelong student of your craft.

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

I'm currently teaching myself audio engineering and would like to release a 50-song project of dhol covers for song from around the world spanning multiple languages and genres. I am also planning to film a documentary to cast a spotlight on female dhol players who are pioneering the way for the next wave of girls and women to pick up the dhol or to pursue any passion that fulfills them.

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

The Pant Project was born out of my personal struggle to find a pair of well-fitted pants. I would often struggle to find in between sizes (I am a 35 waist), and custom inseam lengths (I like a 27 inseam), and knew that finding perfect sizing and fit was something many men had trouble with.. While studying my undergraduate at Wharton Business School in the USA, I was inspired by Bonobos, a brand that offered custom-made pants at prices similar to off the rack. When I moved back to India in 2017, I saw that many brands were offering custom-made shirts (e.g., Bombay Shirt Company) and nobody was focused on pants. I knew this was a problem that needed to be solved, and to date believe that custom-made direct to consumer retail is a space that has a lot of potential.

I didn't pursue further studies and don't have textile qualifications. I learned on the job and its business is in our blood as I am a third-generation entrepreneur from an established textile business family (Banswara Syntex). Before launching The Pant Project our team did a year of research and extensive trials to understand the fit problem that men typically face while buying pants – too baggy, too tight, in-between waist sizes, no room to accommodate athletic thighs, too high rise, no extra-long or extra short inseam length options, bulging pockets, no space for phone storage, not enough stretch in the fabric etc.

I used this research to launch The Pant Project in October 2020 and started a revolution to change the way men shop for their pants, setting the bar high and promising top quality tailoring, great fit, and free alterations.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

I wake up every morning at 4 am and start my day with a morning practice of Vipassana meditation. I'm inspired by the sunrise and like to get in my exercise (a round of golf, a run, or a game of cricket) before 8 am. I'm always down for a healthy (and large) breakfast and love my morning coffee. I'm in the office early, and love to use the time before noon for strategic work. It's when my brain works best. I am inspired by way too many things in life and am generally an extremely curious, often too curious person. If at all, I struggle to focus on only one idea and want to do it all, and that too all at the same time!

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

"This" industry is hard to define. While I am in the apparel business, and while our main manufacturing business at Banswara Syntex is related to making yarn, fabric, and garments for retail brands, along with my brother Udit Toshniwal, I have ventured into e-commerce and direct to consumer business. As an entrepreneur, one dons many hats, and I love having a dynamic role, love interacting with customers, and love that I am thrown new challenges every day. There is little that I don't like about the industry – maybe just the fact that there are way too many average brands out there, and that the industry is full of look-alikes and crowded spaces. We need more innovators that break the mold and more original brands that are from India for the world. With the pace at which new businesses are being launched, I am sure that will happen over the next decade.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I am a sports buff - I compete in an Olympic triathlon every year used to play competitive cricket and golf, and love watching live sporting events!

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

Compassion and empathy are critical to success in the modern world. I'd like to be thought of as the nicest tough boss that anyone has had! I try to be someone who is kind, caring, generous, and competent all at the same time.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

Way too many things! Electric vehicles, internet of things medical devices, yoga, meditation, edtech, performance marketing, finance, the outdoors, and sports of all kinds. Even though I am a very intuitive person, I do try to be as rational as possible about everything (including my passions).

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

Retail as an industry was flourishing before the pandemic, both online and offline. Ever since the Covid –19 pandemic struck, things started getting challenging for the traditional brick and mortar setup of businesses, as the government regulations asked front-of-the-house businesses to remain shuttered in a bid to curb the spread of the contagion through physical gathering. On the back of bleeding fixed costs and no revenues, offline stores have started to shut down and e-commerce has boomed. The convenience of shopping from home and the abundance of options available online have helped the e-commerce industry. We are bullish long term on increasing digital penetration and increasing purchasing power of Indians and very excited about the coming decade for direct to consumer brands in India (and from India for the world).

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

Fortunately, the pandemic has accelerated the transition to online shopping and made it easier to scale an e-commerce only business. The major challenges we have faced include:

Scaling production to meet demand. We did not anticipate so much demand for our project in our third month of operations! It has been a challenge to deliver 100s of pants a day since each pant is custom made and each parcel hand-packed and manually quality controlled. We are now scaling up our team to support even larger volumes!

Shipping all over India, including non-serviceable and remote pin code. Of course the infrastructure of shipping, warehousing, and third-party logistics is improving fast in this country, yet there are still some orders from the corners of India that we have had to find innovative ways to deliver the package to the last mile.

Guiding clients on how to measure, and on getting right measurements the first time. Our stylists have set up virtual appointments to help clients measure themselves, and we created a size guide and size recommendation engine to suggest to clients their ideal waist size and inseam length. We have also created graphics to explain the benefit of different fits (slim fit, tapered fit, and relaxed fit) and what sort of body types they are suited for. This has been a learning process, and part of the digital communication journey.

Fraud orders and fake COD orders. Like any online company, we receive our share of orders where clients confirm to receive as COD and then refuse to accept the pant on delivery, and we are stuck with the inventory which is custom made for them. This is part of the cost of doing business, as a young entrepreneur I just hope the Indian consumer is more and more aware of the impact of such costs on startups.

Learning digital marketing and improving our performance marketing on Facebook, Instagram and Google. Content creation and storytelling is such a key part of brand building, and it has been a whole new learning experience for us to try to communicate the touch, feel, and depth of product experience to our clients over the internet.

We are sure we will continue to face many challenges online, and are ready to embrace them.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

I'm not huge on motivational advice. Motivation is fleeting. Find your why, and go for it, with everything. I try to find wisdom in ancient texts like the Bhagavad Gita and focus on your thoughts and actions, the rest (results) will follow (in due course of time).

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

The Pant Project has ambitious plans to become India's #1 Direct to Consumer Clothing Brand, and to become the world's leading new-age E-Tailor. We want to grow to serve over 1 million Indian customers in our first two years of operation and to achieve an annual sales run-rate of over 100 crore rupees. We would also like to do many events that engage with clients, experiment with pop-up shops, and potentially grow to have an omnichannel strategy of a mix of physical brick & mortar experience centers along with digital as our primary sales channel.

We have started with a focused offering of custom-made pants for men, and over time, would like to grow our range of products to include an entire wardrobe solution, potentially including custom-made shorts, t-shirts, belts, shoes, socks etc.

In the long term, we would also like to expand our global focus, and expand in overseas markets to become a truly global brand, from India for the world.

We want to be known as India's #1 clothing brand, and to have changed the face of direct-to-consumer retail so that many clients are satisfied with having found the perfect solution for their clothing needs, and so that many young entrepreneurs are inspired to launch brands of their own.

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

I have been a Mumbaikar all 36 years of my life or rather a South Mumbaikar and commuting beyond Bandra seemed like a never ending battle until I started my first job at Big 92.7 Fm. During my early years, I was schooled at Queen Mary High School, followed by a degree in commerce from HR College of Commerce & Economics. After my "cocooned" life till graduation, my first tryst with destiny was getting a Degree in Business Management from Mumbai University and getting placed with Big 92.7 Fm. I always aspired to build a career in the field of Media & Broadcasting and this opportunity was a dream come true.

Five years into being a media professional (hopping jobs in pursuit to find that perfectly satisfying job) I realised that doing a 9to9 job is not my calling. A thought that kept disturbing me throughout was why should I make a million bucks for my employer and settle down for a salary instead which was peanuts in comparison? That's when I realised it's time to stop dreaming big and to take the plunge. I quit my job in the year 2013 and took a break for a year and a half. Finally, the big break came in 2014.

I aspired to start an Integrated Marketing & Communications firm and expressed this to a close friend from college. He insisted I attend his exhibition where he would put me in touch with a few clients and I could pitch in for some strategic Marketing initiatives.

With a lot of efforts, I managed to bag my fist project. It was setting up leads for a mobile accessory brand through tele-communication which of course, had nothing to do with PR. I took it up thinking that I need to start somewhere. The next big break came, in the same year, when another friend recommended that I pitch in for representation for a newly opened eggless waffles store. At that time I didn't have anything that would support my pitch. No brand name, no logo, no office, no staff, nothing at all. However the only thing I had was CONFIDENCE and with that confidence I manged to win the account. Since then there has been no looking back! From one to many to multiple projects.

I started my entrepreneurial journey as a lone soldier who had converted her living room into a make-shift office As and when business grew, I hired interns (some of them are now working full time with me) and the team expanded from one to two to three... I realised the time had come to invest in an office space. Finally in the year 2017 I found an investor who was willing to invest in my business venture. He invested in an office space at A/C Market Tardeo which could easily accomodate 10 people. The investor is none other than my Father.:) An investment which is an expensive one but still priceless!

That's when the real journey started, the real spin, the Silver Spin.. 3 years working full time with a team, today the business has grown 500 times, serviced more than 100pkus clients and I can proudly say that we are one of the known agencies in the city:)

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

Hunger! I wake up hungry, hungry to achieve more. Each new day is a new start, a new idea that has to be implemented, a new strategy that has to be spun to reach new heights. I feel every successful deal you concluded or every successful execution of a campaign is a "two second fame". You need to restart each day, each time.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

When a campaign is executed well and we have completed all the deliverables, it is immensely satisfying. If it doesn't go in that direction then it is certainly challenging. Our business depends on our relations with the media industry. We are dependent on that and to strike a balance between the client and the media is challenging. Hence each day is as much challenging as satisfying.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I think if one can read between the lines then they know me beyond my profile, and much beyond the CEO of Silver Spun.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

Communication! You need to communicate not only correctly but also the manner in which you communicate is important. Imagine having a situation where a feature story for a client has gone wrong? How do you tell the journo that his story is not upto the client's expectation? On the other hand how do you pacify your client? This situation multiplied manifold in a regular day scenario.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

There are many faces to my personality. I love occult sciences. I have studied numerology, a little bit about vedic astrology and at the moment I am studying KP astrology. I love cooking too. I feel its therapeutic, at times. Not many know that I am compiling a book of my recipes which I curated during the lock down. Hope it sees the light of the day soon May be then you can prefix Author/to my name apart from Publicist.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

Pretty bad. A lot of journalists have lost their jobs owing to the newspapers and other media shutting down. A lot of PR agencies are out of business and have fired their staff. However it's getting a lot better now..there is a lot of improvement.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

I don't see any major issues.. maybe some operational issues. Thankfully, I personally didn't face any major challenges in the last 6 years.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

Believe in yourself. Focus. Work Hard. Persevere. This is not just so called "gyaan". If you actually apply these principles in the same order, you will definitely have a high probability of success. Firstly believe in yourself that you can do it, next focus on the plan you have set to achieve, work hard towards achieving your goals and persevere till you don't succeed.

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

I am an entrepreneur, blockchain speaker and crypto analyst. As a teenager I founded the internet portal ZeoCities.com, non-profit LDKids.org and wrote for CHIP Magazine. Later, while studying at the University of Texas, Austin, I co-invented the world's first legal Internet-based DVR, RecordTV and was part of the founding team at Perceptivel (a company that developed ECRM software for Fortune 500 clients).

WHAT MOTIVATES YOU TO WORK?

My broad motivation would having the greatest positive impact for the maximum amount of people. Right now that would definitely mean banking the unbanked/underbanked. India is the second largest unbanked country in the world and the banking sector here is ripe for disruptive innovation. There is also a deep inequity in the developing world that is perpetuated by the downtrodden not having access to basic banking services and I think this a problem that could find its solution in technology

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

Working in the blockchain/cryptocurrency industry puts me at the cutting edge of global revolution that is decentralizing finance and democratizing innovation. Blockchain has the potential to be truly transformative technology and I've seen this once before, during the rise of the internet. While I active professionally at the time, I was ill-positioned to play as integral a part as I would have liked. What really drives me, is Blockchain's ability to eliminate middlemen in several industries leading to potentially greater efficiency, transparency and could even lead to the elimination of corruption.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

Given my work and interests thus far, most people assume I graduated with some sort of technical degree however in actuality I am somewhat of a politics junkie. While at college at the University of Texas at Austin, I majored in Government with a minor in Business. Moving to the United States just before 9/11 and having lived there during the Bush and Obama administration, deeply shaped my perspective and influenced my path in college. I developed an abiding interest in the wheels of government both in the United States but also internationally. Perhaps the seeds were sown early on, through constant exposure to classic British comedy like Yes, Minister. A few years into college, I realized I was quite passionate about government and particularly the exercise of democracy as a concept- indeed, that was the subject of my final year college thesis. One of the topics I studied was about how, in a healthy society, the proliferation of democratic principles was paramount and I think that's why the concept of Blockchain/Cryptocurrency and Bitcoin appealed to me so much. I truly believe that blockchain and decentralized finance could be the most liberating and consequential technological innovation of the 21st century.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

I think If you are an entrepreneur or even work at a senior level within a company, a very important skill is being able to distil a vision down to an actionable plan that can be executed by you or your team. Another is having the flexibility and confidence to tackle situations and challenges that you may have not encountered before. One of the best learning experiences I had was when I was working on one of my earliest projects and taking on something that I knew nothing about- hardware development. I had never developed hardware before and with my previous company SmartKlock I really didn't know where to begin. Trying to figure out what it takes to make an idea into a prototype and a prototype into a production ready product was extremely rewarding. I was fortunate to have a team at the time that was dedicated to the mission and curious- some of the worlds greatest discoveries have arisen out of idle curiosity.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

Well, I have a lifelong fascination with the UFOs phenomenon . In fact, one of the earliest things I did professionally was release a program called The UFO Story on CHIP Magazine's free accompanying CD, the program was installed more than half a million times and did prove to be quite popular briefly affording me with 15 minutes of fame among UFO enthusiasts. Recently, however the US government has all but admitted the existence of these sorts of craft even going into some detail about materials recovered from them so I do feel a bit vindicated. I am at my core, a technologist and so when one considers the exotic technology accessible to those researching these advanced craft, blockchain, IOT web streaming and the like can seem quaint in comparison.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

While the pandemic hit all industries hard at first, (cryptocurrency markets for example were deeply depressed) generally speaking the pandemic has been good for the industry. Cryptocurrency is a 24/7 market and so it does tend to benefit when people spend more time at home. In fact, I would suggest that the phenomenal rise of Bitcoin this year has been due in no small part to the pandemic and people being at home more to trade.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

By far the greatest challenge has been the uncertain regulatory environment. For many years the industry operated under a cloud of uncertainty due to an RBI banking ban. Soon after that was overturned in the supreme court however, did we begin hearing indications of a possible legislative blanket ban. While discussions remain ongoing, due to the uncertainty, finding and retaining talent in the industry can be difficult. Its my hope that cooler heads prevail and we see some positive regulation that encourages the good players while eliminating the bad ones.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

Well, while I love the way my life has worked out for me so far, I would not quite recommend my path as a working model for others. It sounds trite but I don't think you can go wrong if you come from a place where you are following your passion. I also think its important to remember, that one can have many passions and in these situations its ok to go for the one that you find most rewarding and not necessarily the one people around you may expect of you.

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

In the fintech industry its hard to predict how the future particularly with the regulatory uncertainty we see today. Broadly speaking I think the kind of innovation most likely to have a positive effect on society's poor are in the areas of social and financial inclusion and these are areas I see as my mission in the coming years.

Nirvi became the most important part of our lives and everything else was insignificant. I enjoy being a hands-on mother."



Though Nirvi is an infant, the actress feels that it is important to inculcate the right values in her. She says, "Children these days are intelligent. You don't need to teach them anything. They grasp many things

But the process of writing my own films, my work, my characters also helps to me to create an universe better & eventually helps me to direct the film better. But its the most challenging & satisfying part.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I am interested in many aspects of life apart from just making flms. I am a avid dog lover & I have recently started exploring cooking where I love to call my closed one at home to cook food for them.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

At the end of the day whatever you pretend or wish to be it's the skill, hardwork & passion which matters the most in terms of longevity where survival becomes the biggest aspect to swim through turbulent times especially.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

The biggest challenge I was facing was the one which everybody faces. How do I get a chance to make my first feature film. Ofcourse I took a different route eventually to reach where I wanted.

Rehearsal, practice, reading, learning, adopting all these are very under rated qualities of people who wish to get into films. No one is responsible for your career option except yourself.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

The zeal of progressing in what I do and my daily targets to accomplish my goals make me wake up every morning. This industry is very challenging, there are new issues and tasks everyday which need to be handled and resolved then and there. If you don't wake up on time, you will lose significant opportunities in business and chances of fixing issues in time.

This is a people dependent business. You can't do it alone. You have to build the right team. Sometimes it is very difficult and challenging to get the right people. Restaurant business is like making a movie but in a day. One dish gets prepared by 8 people in the process. One cuts the vegetable, one makes the curry, one makes the main dish, one garnishes it before getting served, one serves it and one washes the plates and it goes on. When all these processes are in place everyday I feel that the day is very fulfilling.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

Well as a kid I have always been very shy and an introvert. I had to develop the confidence with time to do anything in public and break the barrier. Well not many people know that I am a good dancer now. I love dancing on Bollywood songs. My close friends start cheering me up whenever my favourite songs are played in parties.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

You need to be good with people with whom you work with. You have to be a people person especially when you work with a big workforce, people look up to you. That I'm a yogi.

I am often asked if sex-drugs-n-Rock-n-roll is my way of life, given that I'm a drummer in a band. But honestly I've never understood how a musician can be any less disciplined that an athlete or a yogi. We practice as much, if not more. So yes, even after 20 years of Rock n Roll, I haven't had the need to fit in or smoke weed or consume alcohol, to keep up a reputation.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

Freelance musicians have suffered greatly. Venues in my city had shut down. Thanks to online concerts the scene is picking up but it'll take a while for sure.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

The biggest challenge has been to convince people to look at me neutrally. A girl on the drums is more than just sex appeal. She isn't getting popular just because she's the odd one out. That she can have talent and be better than tonnes of boys, is a fair possibility. I've had to fight my way up. To convince people to let me do my thing. Sly Club managers, prejudiced male colleagues to chauvinists in the audience...it's been fun proving them wrong.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

I would want to earnestly request you, the reader, to encourage your sister, niece, daughter, friend, fiancé or any woman you know. Let them do what they do. Be by them, walk next to them but know they are quite capable of walking their own path.

I dream of starting a school or institute that offers sound therapy and healing methods to children with special needs as well as the aged. My plan is to offer services online initially, and carry it over to the offline space eventually.

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

During my university days, I wanted to pursue character animation. The opportunities back in 2000 were limited and I did not want to move to the US to pursue it. Being a marwari, I had grown up seeing some of the best jewellery and was always fascinated with it. Having an inclination towards jewellery and art, this was something that would come naturally to me.

In 2002 & 2003 I pursued formal training in jewellery designing, manufacturing, gemology and diamond grading from GIA, GII and SNDT. Started my career with jewellery designing and manufacturing under my own brand Prernaa Makhariaa until 2008. Post this I joint Tara Jewellers where I headed jewellery product development and merchandising for a retail chain of 50 stores.

During this I curated a collection under my own name for Tara Jewellers and we did trunk shows across 10 cities back to back with extensive media coverage.

I also showcased my jewellery at the India International Jewellery Week (IIJW). In 2013, during the 10th anniversary issue of Swarovski's Gem Vision book, my jewellery was selected among top 3 from Indian on a global platform.

While designing and manufacturing jewellery, the world of styling jewellery always fascinated me and how the jewellery looked on wearing was equally important. That's when I thought of taking this online and extending my knowledge to the world.



Whenever I would search for jewellery influencers in India, none would show up apart from international ones. This gave me the opportunity and the first mover advantage to become India's first jewellery influencer. The initial 2 years was a struggle as the jewellery industry had no idea what influencing was all about. They would ask questions like "will this come in a magazine, newspaper etc" they had no idea of the potential an online reach will give them.

I have worked very hard to carve this niche of my own. In this journey I have worked with the best of brands like Cartier, Rolex, De Beers, Chanel etc. India's largest OTT platform Tata Sky, Radio Mirchi etc Won many awards and accolades for my work.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

The zest to achieve my goals. I enjoy what I do and until I have a crazy hectic day, it doesn't give me satisfaction. It's not about how many hours I put into work but about assessing how much I achieved at the end of each day.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

When I started my career in jewellery designing and manufacturing, there were challenges to begin a startup, my mother taught me to never give up and constantly boosted my moral.

Later when i joint a corporate, it had its own set of challenges but every day was a learning and perhaps that's why I am where I am today.

When I started jewellery influencing, the indian jewellery industry wasn't ready for this concept, rather most of them did not even know what jewellery influencing is all about. It took me lots of patience and the urge to not give up, make a mark as an influencer. With all due respect, what I feel disheartened about is people in our country do not respect the work of home grown entrepreneurs or brands and constantly look up to international ones for their endeavours even though they have to at times pay more than double the amount.

What's satisfying is my patience and the urge to never give up. My mentor would always tell me - "Prernaa always be ahead of the game." and that's something that has been etched in my mind.

I don't shy away from taking risks and maybe that helps me with the first mover advantage in most of my projects. It's not always about the money, at the end of the day I should feel happy and enjoy what I am doing. Success doesn't enamour me and failure doesn't let me down. I am like that turtle from the hare and turtle story who likes to try until I succeed.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

There is a saying in hindi "haathi ke daath khane ke aur dikhane ke aur hote hai" which means that my profile may be very glamorous due to what it looks like on the screen but what one doesnt know is that effort and hard work to put that together.

Eg. All the glamorous jewellery looks you see on my profile, there are times I wake up at 3 or 4am to get ready for a shoot at 6am to which the audience only sees the end result of that shoot.

As outgoing and modern my work profile demands me to be, I am a very private person when it comes to my personal and family life. Eg. I did not even have an instagram account till I turned into an influencer.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

Being patient is very important. Don't be let down by failures, they help you learn.

There will be good days and bad days. On a bad day, if you are not upto working, its absolutely ok. Take that break but make sure that the next day you get kicking.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

There is no such thing that I do not enjoy.

Talking about things that I am passionate about is traveling, adventure sports, watching sports and playing it. These give me a high.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

When the lockdown was announced, the gems and jewellery industry in India was affected big time. Gold and Silver were rocketing at their all time high. Luxury sector was affected in a big way.

However I must say that this also gave the opportunity to the industry to become digitally savvy. People who had never done digital and online meetings were operating businesses online, showcasing and selling jewellery through video calls.

Things began to change around August when consumers slowly started moving out and seeking appointments with jewellers. The wedding season of October to December has been very busy with bridal jewellery orders flocking. It gave the jewellers a relief as they made great sales which they weren't hoping.

However when it comes to online marketing, things have changed for good during the lockdown as jewellery shows were being held online virtually and many brands have re-worked on their social media and digital spends.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

When I started jewellery influencing the concept of jewellery influencing was alien and I struggled in the initial 2 years to make people understand its concept, while luxury and lifestyle influencing was flourishing.

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

I am Sarah Tantray, Co-Founder of Wild West Innovations, a start-up based out of Mumbai. I was born in Kashmir and moved to Mumbai for my education in 2006, the same year my Father was shot dead. At that time I was only 14 years old, so after attending my Father's funeral within 10 days I was back to Mumbai to give my exams.

It was only possible for me to do that because of my sister's courage and love, she took up all the responsibilities and helped me continue my education here. I graduated in BMM (Bachelor's in Mass Media) from Sophia College and post that started working immediately.

After, a year I decided to get back to education and started my Master's in Film Studies from Mumbai University. While studying, I was working part time and joined another organization related to CSR, it was during this time that I along with my Partner came up with this Idea. So, in 2016 we Founded 'Wild West Innovations' and since then have installed around 250 'ReBots' across the Country.



WHAT MOTIVATES YOU TO WORK?

We live in a world where we have finite natural resources and an ever-growing population. To meet growing demands of humans, we need to think out of box and come up with solutions which don't put further pressure on our depleting resources. As an organization, we are a big part of Circular-Economy, so being able to re-use and recycle waste into new products is something which motivates me. Knowing that our work is making a difference is something that keeps me going. At some point, the future generations will be grateful to start-ups like ours who are working in Eco field.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

Our Industry is an unorganised sector and people treat it as a non-essential service. So, working on a project like ours is very challenging. Most people don't understand the concept and even the Governments are not doing enough to promote projects related to Recycling compared to other countries.

At the same time, what I find most satisfying is when children interact with us and there is so much enthusiasm and knowledge that they possess about our Industry. So, working with these children is an absolute bliss.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

The most interesting thing about me that you probably wouldn't get to know from my profile is that I love spontaneity in everyday life. I like to make sudden plans and go with the flow. I don't believe much in planning and believe life is to be lived on a bit of faith rather than our understanding. If I wasn't in Bombay then I would be skiing in the mountains probably.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

One needs to be extremely patient and believe in what they are doing. You need enough conviction and perseverance. Also, staying updated about the latest technology related to our field is important.

I am a movie buff, I absolutely love movies, travel and fitness. Different cultures and languages fascinate me.

Pre-pandemic lot of things were moving in the right direction, for example the Government came up with EPR (Extended Producer's Responsibility) which would really give a boost to our Industry. Unfortunately, post-pandemic everything has slowed down and we have start from the scratch. Things are lot of more difficult now.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

The biggest challenge so far is that our Industry is an unorganised sector and there is not enough awareness among people. They don't realise that this is our future, what we call waste today is going to be our resources in the future.

Not being taken seriously is the biggest challenge that I have faced working in this field.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

I would say that our future depends on Recycling, if you have an idea or are passionate about environment you should follow it. There is going to be lot of demand in future for Ecopreneurs.

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

We are currently working on moving to other types of plastic waste, so we want to be known for providing 'One Stop Recycling Solution's' out there. So, far we have been only known in the PET field. Personally, I would like to work with International Organizations and expand our service globally.

Q & A

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

I have been brought up in a household, where books are your best friends. My father, being a renowned author, historian and social activist along with being an entrepreneur instilled values of living a balanced life, filled with knowledge, power, literature as well as the ability to materialise any hobby. My mother, an extremely loving and caring person has always taught us the value of unconditional love and empathy. She is a counselor without learning counselling skills. She has always listened to me patiently and has been a rock solid support throughout. I was in 10th standard when I was supposed to make a career decision. All my friends back then were opting for engineering or medicine or architecture. My school had incorporated career counselling in our last year there, and my aptitude test results were great. I was told basically that I could do anything I wanted. I was always a bright student, and a favourite of many teachers. They all urged me to study engineering followed by an MBA, a typical route. It suited me well as well, because my father owned a software company back then, and I was destined to run it. I was certain that I would study computers and then go for a degree in management. My father, on the other hand, was against me taking the generic route. He introduced me to a whole new world of economics, psychology, philosophy, marine life, astronomy, etc by bringing home a bulk of books on each subject. He would always tell me that the world needs people in unexplored areas. I started reading these books and was always fascinated by these arenas. What really shaped my career decision was a very unfortunate incident. My maternal uncle, who I was closest to amongst all relatives, died by suicide a few months before my board exams.



I couldn't believe what had happened. He was always so jovial and full of life. When I heard that he was seeking treatment for depression and was heavily medicated towards the end, I was heart broken. I could never imagine my uncle being in depression. This is what made me take a firm resolution. I wanted to study psychology to help people like my uncle. I was certain I did not want to become a psychiatrist in India. I couldn't keep thinking throughout my 10th that I wish he had someone he could speak to. Someone who could identify why he is going through what he is going through and could help him relieve his pain. I learnt a very important lesson that month. Each and every person around us, each and every smiling face, has faced suffering. You never know who might be suffering in the moment you are speaking with them. Who is thinking of ending their life while we are speaking with them. If I can just do my bit, and know a little bit more about human behaviour, I can help save a life. This is how I decided to study psychology and I began my career.

I completed my studies as one of the top in the university, from Fergusson College, Pune. Immediately I got to work after my Masters. I started off as a remedial educator & psychologist in Academy for Counselling & Education (ACE). I went through training simultaneously. I started working with children who had learning disabilities like dyslexia & dysgraphia, ADHD, Autism, slow learners. A lot of work with these children was to build their skill levels rather than help them with their studies. A child is unable to read because the neural processes required for reading are not as developed. So, our job was to help each and every child who came to us, develop these skill sets through play and fun. During this time, I was involved in a lot of research, and we were on the verge of developing a standardised model to help these kids across all our centres in Mumbai and Pune. The reason being, each and every remedial educator was working differently with each child, and developing IEPs (Individualised Education Plans) as per their own experience. This led to differing progress in multiple children. When we saw that this is the state everywhere else in schools as well, owing to the fact that Remedial education training in India is still in its nascent stages, and most remedial educators end up teaching school syllabus, we decided to take up this herculean challenge of trying to standardise the process. I was then designated as Head for Training, research & Development, when I was merely 25 years old. The work on this project had already started a year ago, and I was one of the people leading this project. Post my promotion, this project became my baby, and we successfully developed a software that can reach a diagnosis in 5 minutes along with an IEP designed for the child. The IEP would then keep changing based on the new model's monitoring process, and the remedial educator would be provided with all the necessary equipment as a part of the IEP. This made the job of each educator so easy, and therefore, the educator could focus more on the emotional development of each child, as the IEP and identification was taken care of. Today, thousands of children are benefitting from this model and the reason I speak so proudly about this, is because for the first time, an Indian organisation had linked psychology with technology and created something that would change thousands of lives. This was one of my biggest achievements and this project took 3 years of my life's dedication.

At ACE, I designed several training programs, and trained thousands of individuals in remedial education, counselling, psychometric testing, psychotherapy. I personally would do all of this and conduct at least 3-4 sessions with my clients each day. I used to literally be in office for 14-15 hours each day! My schedule hasn't changed much since!

In 2016, I was going through a rough time personally. I did not think that having depression in my genes, could also lead me towards the same path. Being a psychologist doesn't stop you from being human. And this was the time, when I attempted suicide twice. My work started getting affected, but luckily the founders at ACE were highly empathetic. They helped me in every way possible. It took me almost 6 months to get back to normalcy, but a part of me never became the way it was before. This is the time, everything shifted for me. I realised that my life calling was not where I already was. I wanted to dedicate my resources to suicide prevention. Having been there, I knew exactly how it feels. This is when I quit ACE, and I started my own organisation called CEDAR in August 2017. CEDAR stands for Center for Depression Anxiety Relationships-most common causes of suicide. CEDAR was launched with literally INR 400/- in my bank account, and it has reached a stage today, where we are completely self sufficient and helping even more people than before. The struggle in starting a new organisation in a different city, with no money and little help, is a story for another time.

Today we have 10 counsellors and many more as volunteers who are dedicated towards the same goal. We as an organisation do a lot of pro bono work to help people in difficult times. I never left remedial education. Before the lockdown, I would go to Kothrud and do remedial teaching for children who cannot afford remedial services of well known private institutions, with the help of a Doctor, who lent me their clinic premises to do this work. Our organisation, post lockdown provided free counselling services to people all across the country to deal with COVID related anxiety and through this program, we helped thousands of people who could not otherwise afford mental health services.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

There are many things about my work that motivate me. I conduct almost 7–8 sessions every single day. It is slightly more than a psychologist is prescribed to work. However, I work with some really critical cases of depression and couples who are on the verge of separation. I work with a lot of families who have been struggling with disputes, conflicts and depression. Each and every session, for me, is goal oriented. The thought of each client's progress in the last session and to work on an aspect of his/her personality or thought process or emotional journey, and to see it working for them is what takes me through the day. When I see something shifting in my client's consciousness, and they also see the subtle changes that are being brought about in their lives, is my primary motivator.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

What I find most satisfying in my work is the changes that I help bring about in people's perspectives. When the same person, who is struggling with anxious thoughts and suicidal thoughts, learns to help themselves, and becomes empowered to deal with their emotions and life circumstances, and when they reach a point where they do not need my help as frequently, I find it satisfying. The most challenging part, however, is the emotional burnout that it leads to. If I do not work on myself simultaneously, or meditate often, it can make the line between empathy and sympathy blurry, often leading to personal frustration. No matter the experience, the human element in me, overpowers the psychologist in me, sometimes.



These are the times, when, to keep going on becomes slightly tough and I have to keep looking at motivators constantly. As this is work, where the results are not as tangible as you may want to see, you can often get demotivated and burnt out.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I am a trained classical singer and an artist as well. This is something I have never mentioned in my profile. However, I go to my music classes regularly, and I practice the part taught to me during the week, with as much dedication. I paint once every 3 months, whether it is on the canvas or on the wall!! Along with this, I am fascinated with mythology and history. I read a lot of material related to these subjects and I find a lot of life lessons from both. There is just so much to learn. I am also a basketball player and enjoy working on my fitness. Sports is an amazing way to combine the body and the mind. It helps me stay connected and united with myself.

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

To succeed in my career path, the most important thing is EMPATHY. It is often a part of personality rather than a skill set, I have realised over the years. Other than empathy, excellent listening skills, analytical skills and articulation is extremely important. Analytical skills are very important, because as you are listening, you are also observing, and constantly questioning "why did he/she say this or use these particular words or where is this emotion coming from?". There are several models of personality and therapy that are not generic. You need to be highly aware and pick and choose a combination which can work best for each and every client. The ability to switch seamlessly from one client to the next is extremely important or you may carry the analysis of the previous session into the next one. Articulation and usage of the right words and language is again very important. You cannot be the reason of another trigger in your client due to wrong words. You are a good psychologist when you understand that a single word from your mouth can either relieve a person or trigger them.

You need to be a person who is kind yet assertive; calm yet strong; patient yet goal oriented; having good self esteem yet aware of ones flaws; somebody who keeps working on themselves yet in acceptance of their own self. Working in this field requires a lot of dedication. You need to know exactly why you are doing what you are doing. You cannot take the troubles of your clients to bed with you. You need to know when to let go and disconnect cords with people. I have seen many counsellors leaving their jobs or practice because of these reasons. It is not anyone's fault. However, being a psychologist means that you will need to have a lot of clarity in your purpose, otherwise it can become easily demotivating.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

I believe all passions are irrational. However, personally, I am passionate about writing horror stories and watching horror films!



I know this is so completely out of character and a lot of people around me do not believe me when I tell them this, because they always expect a psychologist to be very positive!! However, I have no rationale for this and no words can explain this particular hobby. All my short stories are horror or thriller genre, and there must not be a single horror or thriller or supernatural film or series that I must not have watched.

HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

For obvious reasons, the mental health industry has picked up quite well post pandemic. The pandemic triggered a lot of fears and anxieties in people. Social isolation and lack of freedom and control due to the lockdown led a lot of people to seek mental health services without attending to the stigma of it all. Pre-pandemic, there were a couple of challenges owing to the stigma associated with visiting a psychologist or a psychiatrist. The only cases we would get pre pandemic were critical, severe, and the prognosis would be slightly difficult. However, post pandemic, a lot of work started at initial stages of anxiety and depression in people. As far as clinical cases are concerned, the pandemic situation did not help as much, because physical in person sessions ceased, and most people with severe OCD, psychosis, bipolar, etc. paused treatment, as they were not comfortable speaking from their homes. So, the pandemic had a mixed impact on this industry.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

Specifically in India, the biggest challenge is a shortage of trained and licensed staff. The rules are not very rigid or strict in India when it comes to mental health and has led to a lot of crisis due to wrong diagnosis or treatment. Therefore, the biggest challenge that I was facing as a founder of an organisation was training the workforce, and retaining them. Other than that, a personal challenge that I have faced in this industry is retaining clients, who need long term treatment. As mental health services are expensive, and most people cannot afford the same for a longer duration, it becomes very difficult to ensure completion of therapy. Making it affordable for the masses, means there is a huge personal loss that as a professional you need to endure. Simply because, unlike other professionals, the time investment and energy investment is much more. Even NGOs cannot afford to keep on too many counsellors, as each session duration in itself is 45-60 minutes. Also, if a client does not turn up for a session, it is not only a loss to the professional, but the time cannot even be given to someone else who needs it more. From a more global perspective, mental health services, aren't even taken seriously by most people. Therefore, efficacy of therapy becomes an issue. The biggest challenge I faced was when clients start feeling better and discontinue therapy, only to relapse further on, and then deeming therapy as ineffective, which in turn discourages others to take on therapy.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS A RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

I strongly believe in keeping my INTENTION in check. Whichever industry you belong to, when you know why you are doing what you are doing, you will have a greater impact in your own life along with others. Whether you are employed, self employed or an employer, being sure of your intention is the key to change.

Getting comfortable has never proven beneficial to anyone. Keep testing your limits. Whenever you get complacent, understand that you have now the space to explore more. There is so much more in life than we can even imagine. Change is going to be uncomfortable, however, it is a fact of life. It is alright if you do not have a singular purpose in life. You can always keep exploring multiple things, and have several avenues open for yourself. There is no one thing that needs to keep you going. You can wake up to a new morning every single day. A lot of times, we get disappointed in our failures, and overjoyed by our successes. However, a failure and success can exist only when we have singularity of purpose. When you treat a failure as an opportunity, you will realise that you have the choice of multiple possibilities, and several doors are open for you. What you do with that choice is completely up to you. There was a point in my life when I didn't feel like going on. It felt as though all doors are shut and there is no other option left. However, I am a living example of how things can turn around. Life is about learning. Keep on learning. When we are learning, the process of failure and success becomes combined and acceptable. There is lesser disappointment and even lesser expectations.

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

I am planning on multiple projects currently. One of the key projects is a series of books on mental health, combining mythology with psychology and some fiction novels. Other than that, I plan on starting a suicide prevention helpline associated with technology on your fingertips, where you will be provided instant help when you need it. This is already work in progress, and we hope to launch soon. I am also planning on building an institute only for studies in psychology, where maximum branches of psychology can be taught by experienced people under one roof in India.

I have tried to answer all questions as much as I could. There is much more to express, however, do let me know if you wish me to clarify anything further on. Once again, I thank you for this opportunity!

Even though much of your time as an artist will be spent alone working on your various pieces, it's still incredibly important to have interpersonal skills, especially when talking to people who are viewing your art and potentially leasing or buying it for their own collections elsewhere. Having a person's person is equally important.

I am passionate about life. As an artist being devoted comes naturally to me. I enjoy good music. I am also an avid reader of literature. I have a zest for traveling. Exploring places boosts my artistic mind. I believe there is nothing more truly artistic than to love or to appreciate nature.



HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

Arts and culture have experienced significant economic setbacks from COVID-19. Across the spectrum of artistic and creative endeavours, restrictions on gatherings, changes in consumer behaviour (voluntary or otherwise), and severe unemployment have taken a devastating toll on the sector. The full scope and scale of the impact can be hard to discern, in part because of the size and diversity of the industries and occupations that constitute arts and culture. However, there is one positive side to all of this. Artists are inclined to enhance their creativity in order to express in the digital form. I can see art galleries conducting virtual exhibitions. On top of that I have explored abstract art in digital form. I find this form very captivating and truly an evaluation of abstract art. I am able to see much more potential in this form of art.

Q & A

CAN YOU TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOURSELF AND YOUR CAREER PATH SO FAR?

I began my career in the field of physical commodity trading with one of the worlds largest independent steel traders based out of London, UK immediately after completing my Undergraduate degree there. Having always had a keen interest and affinity towards relationship management, client servicing and of-course sales and marketing; it was the right platform for me to begin my career path. I've been through the grind of getting coffees for senior traders, running around the photocopier frantically, doing the odd bank errands for the finance department; and today I realise that those aspects of the job were critical in developing key skill sets that have not only elevated my capabilities professionally, but have further added to my personal growth over the years. What seemed like mundane and odd tasks given by my seniors had a larger meaning to it all.

I worked my way up from a trainee trader to a trader, handling the European markets along with Africa and eventually started handling my own book for South Asia. Cross-cultural management and interactions were always a driving force for me as my job gave me platforms to interact and negotiate with individuals of different countries around the globe.

Once I decided to pursue my MBA in International Marketing from EU Business School, Barcelona; I went in with the mindset that this would open more doors for me to possibly get my foot into other industries which though mutually exclusive, would benefit from my experience and skill sets developed over the years, and that's how I landed up getting into the Education Industry.



Today as the Director and Chief Marketing Officer, I am responsible for ensuring that not only our operational schools function in an efficient manner and impart quality education to students across India, but also make good returns for our investors and in turn for the company. I also look into the expansion of the brand Pan India with a very talented team of individuals without whom it would have been an uphill task to achieve 80 percent growth rates consistently over the past years till date. WHAT IS IT ABOUT YOUR WORK THAT MAKES YOU WANT TO GET UP EVERY MORNING?

The aspect of providing a solution, in this case, schools; across the nation and plugging the gap present in the system, effectively is a huge motivator. At the core of what I do in the company, the aspects that have driven me since my University days are still enforced on a daily basis and that; I believe is the biggest single reason that makes me want to get up every morning.

WHAT PART OF YOUR OCCUPATION DO YOU PERSONALLY FIND MOST SATISFYING AND MOST CHALLENGING?

I tend to look at this from a perspective where overcoming challenges is always the most satisfying feeling an individual can achieve. Education and more importantly the right approach to education is the most challenging aspect of my occupation. Investors want to set up schools, however often are misinformed about the processes and the gestation period of the project. Some look at it purely from a business aspect and some purely from a social service one; and finding the right mix of the two is the most challenging aspect of my occupation.

WHAT'S THE MOST INTERESTING THING ABOUT YOU THAT WE WOULDN'T LEARN FROM YOUR PROFILE ALONE?

I am highly meticulous in my approach towards everything. I still believe in writing down notes and following through on them, adhering to my calendar appointments set up, planning ahead and ensuring I have zero emails by the end of the week!

WHAT SKILLS ARE THE MOST CRUCIAL TO SUCCEEDING IN THIS CAREER? WHAT TYPE OF PERSON DO YOU NEED TO BE?

You have to keep an open mind and the passion has to shine through in each interaction you have. Being able to think quickly and swiftly on your feet, stepping up and making decisions is not the only skill set you require; one must take accountability and responsibility of the same.

You need to be someone who follows through on what is committed and ensures that there is constant support being provided over and above the dotted lines on a contract.

WHAT ARE SOME THINGS OUTSIDE OF WORK THAT YOU'RE IRRATIONALLY PASSIONATE ABOUT?

Music and Football tend to resonate with me at a passionate level outside of work. I am not into any specific form of music and tend to listen to songs in various languages which use melodies that not only soothe and rejuvenate me but also introduce me to instruments and sounds that transcend boundaries.



HOW IS THIS INDUSTRY AFFECTED BY THE ECONOMY PRE AND POST-PANDEMIC?

Unfortunately, the education sector is hit pretty hard post-pandemic and is yet to see an uptick in investments; which are subdued owing to the uncertainty in the market. Whilst we would certainly not want to risk children and teachers to the virus, state government norms being different from state to state have hampered growth and certainly taken investors back minimum 2 years on their investments made. I do hope that they receive more aid to ensure existing and new edupreneurs are not discouraged by the sector.

Pre-pandemic, we would sign up close to 20–30 schools, and the number has come down to roughly 10–15 now with no clear operational dates.

FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE, WHAT ARE THE PROBLEMS YOU SEE WORKING IN THIS FIELD? WHAT WAS THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE YOU WERE FACING?

I think when it comes to marketing, the problem I see and the biggest challenge I face is setting realistic expectations and educating people that marketing is in itself a broad term that is loosely thrown around and often held responsible for aspects that it should not. Sales is a different vertical and is often mixed with marketing and even in marketing, you have various sub-sets of marketing that need to be clearly outlined and planned in accordance to your goals. To truly achieve an Omni channel marketing model, one needs to intricately understand the nuances of marketing as a whole.

MOVING FORWARD, DO YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL WORDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR READERS AS RESULT OF YOUR EXPERIENCE?

I think being realistic in your approach and planning ahead are important aspects that individuals need to keep as their anchors. Don't become a "yes" man or woman, analyse aspects from a viewpoint others would probably miss analysing from and don't give up! Perseverance is surprisingly more beneficial than you can imagine it to be.

ON THE LAST NOTE, WOULD YOU LIKE TO GIVE US AN INSIGHT ON YOUR FUTURE PLANS

I avoid talking about future plans as they are constantly being built upon, however the priority right now is for me to ensure that all our investors and stakeholders like the children in our schools, their parents, staff recover from this downturn and roadblock brought upon by Covid, and come out stronger and with a smile on their faces that goes ear to ear!
